

INTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

Botanikai Közlemények publishes original research articles and review papers of high-quality from all disciplines of botany including floristics, systematics, phytocoenology, phytogeography, paleobotany, conservation, anatomy and morphology, physiology, ecology, ecophysiology, genetics, horticulture, and history of botanical science. The language of manuscripts can be Hungarian or English. For contributions written in Hungarian, the title, keywords, abstract and captions for figures and tables are also given in English for the convenience of an international readership. Manuscripts should be submitted as rich text format (rtf) document attached to an e-mail message sent to the editor. In the fields of systematics, floristics, phytogeography, phytocoenology and conservation, the manuscript should be sent to András VOJTKÓ (Department of Botany and Plant Physiology, Eszterházy Károly University, H-3301 Eger, P.O.Box 43.; vojtkoa@gmail.com), while in the disciplines of plant ecology, anatomy, morphology, physiology, ecophysiology, paleobotany, genetics and applied botany to Tibor KALAPOS (Department of Plant Systematics, Ecology and Theoretical Biology, Eötvös Loránd University, H-1117 Budapest, Pázmány P. stny 1/C; kalapos@caesar.elte.hu). In the case of plant anatomy, genetics and physiology, contributions should have a field botany aspect. Manuscripts not within the scope of the journal are returned immediately to the authors. EACH ENGLISH-LANGUAGE MANUSCRIPT SHOULD BE SENT TO TIBOR KALAPOS (kalapos@caesar.elte.hu).

Manuscript structure

- Title page
 - Title
 - Name of authors
 - Authors' affiliation, postal address, e-mail address
 - short running title (not more than 50 characters including spaces)
 - keywords (up to six listed in alphabetical order)

Starting on page 1, then running continuously:

- Abstract, Introduction, Material and methods, Results, Discussion, Acknowledgements (if any), References, and – if the language of the manuscript is Hungarian – the followings in English: manuscript title, name, affiliation, postal and e-mail addresses of the authors, keywords and abstract.
- Subsequent pages include the tables and figures, each on separate page. For manuscripts written in Hungarian, table and figure captions should be bilingual, Hungarian and English.

Required contents of manuscript sections

The **Introduction** briefly summarizes earlier research in the field covering most important findings from the literature and from the authors' previous work. These are followed by an explicit statement on the purpose of the study reported in the manuscript.

The **Material and methods** covers the subject of the study, materials used, methods applied to collect data and statistical tests used for evaluating data. The information provided in this section should be sufficiently detailed to make the work repeatable.

The **Results** contains the new findings from the research documented in well-arranged, easy-to-understand figures and tables. Redundancy from presenting the same data in both tables and figures should be avoided. Figures and tables should contain only those data which are essential for the documentation of new findings. Lengthy tables and figures may be published as electronic (online) supplements downloadable from the journal's homepage, but not appearing in print.

In the **Discussion** results should be evaluated and discussed in the light of relevant literature and the authors' previous work. Emphasis should be placed on novel findings.

The **Abstract** should focus on the aims, methods and new findings of the research, and should avoid introduction, discussion, literature reference or results from the authors' previous studies. For manuscripts written in Hungarian, the content of the Hungarian and English language Abstracts should be identical.

The **References** should list only those sources cited in the text.

Manuscript formatting

Manuscripts should be prepared by using a computer word processing program (Times New Roman font, 12 points size, 1.5 pitch, 2.5 cm margins). Total manuscript length – including references, tables and figures – should not exceed 30 pages. Please, provide continuous line numbering for the text on the left margin. Manuscripts should be submitted as rich text format (rtf) documents attached to an e-mail message sent to the editor. Use Arial font on figures. Figures should also be prepared in the format of 600 dpi image (jpeg or tif) files, but these will be required only upon acceptance of the manuscript for publication. Please, do not insert figures or tables in the manuscript text, these should be given after the References on separate pages each as described above. Colour images are not accepted, thus prepare figures in B&W or grayscale. Each variable should be reported in SI units. Leave two blank lines above and one below section titles. The first line of paragraphs should be indented to 1 cm. Please, do not use tabulator or multiple spaces for indentation. Throughout the manuscript, use small capitals for all author names (including species authors), and italics for scientific names of species. Please, do not use other formatting in the manuscript. Within-text references to literature sources should be formatted as

- for one author (JÁVORKA 1964)

- for two authors (MÁTHÉ and PRÉCSÉNYI 1973)

- for more than two authors (ZÓLYOMI et al. 1967).

When more than two sources are cited at a place, use comma for separating the works of different authors (UDVARDY 1998, CZIMBER 2006), and semicolon for separating multiple works of the same author from that of other authors (SOÓ 1964, 1980; KOVÁCS and PRISZTER 1977). Multiple citations should be arranged in chronological order of publication, alphabetical order of author names should be applied only for those sources published in the same year. When the author is the subject of the sentence – which is warranted for if the author as a person is mentioned, not his/her work or statement

– then the year of publication should be given in parentheses after the author's name: according to JUHÁSZ-NAGY (1986) etc. Please, do not insert hyphen between co-authors.

In the References, citations should be listed in strict alphabetical order, in the case of identical authors use chronological order. Follow the samples below for formatting various types of literature.

Figures, tables, other illustrations, electronic supplement

Figures should be prepared in high quality, press-ready format, and their size should be such that zooming-out should cause no loss of details. Particularly, the lettering of graphs should use font sizes sufficiently large to remain readable in the smaller print format. The maximum size of figures in print is 12.5 x 19.5 cm. In the manuscript text, table(s) and figure(s) should be referred to in the order of their numbering at least once at an appropriate place.

Manuscripts not meeting the above criteria will not be considered for publication and will be returned to the authors. Editors neither translate or correct texts, nor prepare or format figures and tables. Each manuscript is reviewed by two anonymous reviewers, the editor decides on acceptance. It is the authors' task to revise their manuscript by using the advice received from the reviewers and the editor. Authors are responsible for the proof-reading and the overall content of their manuscript. In print, the date of acceptance is indicated for each contribution.
